

LGBT Youth-Related Issues

This bibliography provides an overview of basic resources related to sexuality, development and care-related needs of LGBT youth. There is very limited information on bisexual, transgender and youth who are questioning their sexual orientation, with substantially less information on lesbian and bisexual girls, compared with gay and bisexual male youth.
